

Help Stock Our Food Pantry

Our cupboards are becoming bare from helping many people over the past couple of weeks. We have given food out to five to seven individuals a week who are having a hard time, many of them are homeless. When you go to the grocery store next, please pick up a few items for our food pantry. The pantry allows us to help, and it also guarantees they get food (when we give food cards, who knows what they buy). Bring the items below back next week and place them in the collection bin located in the patio area. You may also give a monetary donation above and beyond your regular giving, and we will shop for food items as needed. Please make sure to write "Food Pantry" on the memo line of your check or giving envelope.

Pantry food items needed: Canned meat products (chicken, beef, pork, Vienna sausages, Spam), canned pastas with meat, canned chili with meat, granola or protein bars, canned fruits and vegetables (buy things you would like to eat), bottled fruit juices (100% juice in plastic bottles), jelly, and can openers. **Canned food with pull-off lids is especially helpful** when we are giving food to homeless people. BIBLE READING CHALLENGE

We need to learn more of the word of God than just what we get in Sunday sermons. So if you don't have a weekly Bible reading plan, how about reading **the books of Job and Ecclesiastes** over the next few months.

Both of these books challenge popular thinking/philosophies, which is sometimes worldly thinking but sometimes is thinking among Christians. In both of these books, as you read, look for ways of thinking/philosophies that are still around today. What does the book you are reading have to say (it may not say it until the end) that opposes those philosophies? Also, from what you know of the New Testament, what does God's word teach that opposes those philosophies? If you don't know, maybe talk to a Bible-knowledgable Christian friend about it.

Here is a little more on Job. Job is about a man who suffers greatly. People often bring up Job in the conversation about why there is suffering. But ultimately, it's about a godly person's journey with suffering that seems unfair, his perspective on God, and others' perspectives on God. Probably the most fascinating parts of Job are at the beginning and the end. Pay close attention to the details in those parts. Honestly, in the middle, some of the dialogue can get wearisome, but try to pay attention to the reading focus.

On YouTube, there are animated videos done by BibleProject that can help you understand the book as a whole, which in turn can help you understand the parts. On YouTube, search Book of Job Summary, and Book of Ecclesiastes Summary; the videos are by BibleProject. It might be helpful to watch these video before you read each book and even periodically review the video.

You can target reading six or seven days, but saying five days gives some room for missing. We usually like to say plan on reading and thinking for five minutes, because saying five minutes keeps you from thinking you don't have time for it. If you spend about 5 minutes per day reading a small section and reflecting on it, and you do this for five days a week, it could take you three months or five months, depending on how much time you take to process while reading.

If you would like a tool to help you with deciding what portion to read each day, with interpreting, and with application, we have bookmarks which contain help on those things, as well as help with prayer. Pick one up in the loaner-Bible stand, at the back of the worship center.

If you don't have another way you teach your kids the Bible, each day you read, share with your kids the Bible passage (in an age-appropriate way) and have a discussion about what you learned.

Sound Doctrine Ministry Training Academy

In Uganda, the majority of the population claims to be Christian, and there are thousands of churches. But most of the Christians are very immature, or even misled, because they are not being taught the truth of the word of God. The majority of pastors in Uganda have had bad theology passed to them and poor Bible interpretation practices, so they desperately need training. The pastors don't have access to good training nor the money to afford training. Volunteer teachers, who are graduates of Sound Doctrine, who are overseen by Walter, travel to various villages to train pastors. Over the course of one year, the pastors get trained in good Bible interpretation principles, sound theology, good biblical preaching practices, and other practical theologies of leadership, family, and finances. Sound Doctrine Ministry Training Academy has graduated 1,731 ministers in seven years.

A few months into the new school year, there are 48 centers running, with 1,231 students attending. It is the rainy season in Uganda, which brings certain challenges. All of the centers are in villages, which usually means dirt roads, which in this season means mud roads. It makes it difficult for students and teachers to get to classes. It is also a season for more mosquitoes, which means more malaria in families. That also affects attendance.

Walter's 70-year-old mom just had a major surgery, removing an 11 pound mass. His brother died, and they don't know the cause yet. He was just found dead in his house. He leaves behind a wife and three children. One of the volunteer teachers, Odoi Moses, is having severe stomach issues that they haven't been able to diagnose. He hasn't been able to teach or pastor. Walter is having a hard time with all of this.
