The setting

Jesus instructed two disciples to get two specific donkeys.

If asked, say the Lord needs them.

Fulfillment of prophecy (Zechariah 9:9)

Jesus is King.

Jesus came as a gentle Messiah, not a conquering warrior.

Riding on a colt, the foal of a beast of burden

The crowd treated Jesus as their coming king.

The crowd hailed Jesus as the Messiah and savior.

All of Jerusalem was curious about Jesus.

How this crowd would turn on Jesus.

Will you only praise Jesus and follow Him when He does what you want?

Application questions for 11/16/2014 sermon Matthew 21:1-11

First, on the side point Christian made (regarding verse 3), do you have the attitude of, “Whatever I have, I will gladly give it, or lend it, if the Lord wants it.”?

If so, why do you have that attitude?

If not, do you want that attitude to change, and what do you perceive has to happen with your thinking for your attitude to change?

Do you know and really believe that Jesus has carried your sins to the cross, and dealt with them, taken them out of the way between you and God, if you trust Jesus? (besides just answering “yes” or “no”, you can elaborate if you wish)

If so, do you really believe that in doing that Jesus has done the greatest thing for you, He has met your greatest need?

Do you believe He owes you anything else?

Do you expect for Him to do what you want Him to do, or fix problems in your life the way you want them fixed?

If you say you don’t believe He owes you anything and you don’t expect Him to do what you want Him to do, do you really live like that is true?

Is there something that has happened to you that has made you mad that God didn’t do what you wanted, or didn’t fix something the way you wanted it?

Has that caused you to not be fully committed to following Jesus?

How do you think you can prepare yourself to not have that response when there is something you want God to do or fix?
