(Ref.: Colossians 1:16, John 1:3)

The Son uniquely reveals God, because of who He is.

He is the radiance of God's glory.

He is the representation of God's nature.

More reasons to listen to the Son:

His word is supremely powerful.

He provided so you can be cleansed of your sins.

He is our rightful ruler, enthroned in heaven.

Application questions for 1/3/2016 sermon

Hebrews 1:1-3

The Ultimate Revelation of God, the Son

(This week, there is no one question I want to make sure everyone answers. So try to make sure everyone responds to at least one of the questions.)

Why is it significant that God has spoken to us by the Son?

The Son made everything. Why is that significant when deciding whether to listen to His directions about life?

The Son is the representation of God's nature. So when we look at how Jesus acted/lived, how is that important for our lives?

The Son has provided so you can be cleansed of your sins. How does that affect the way you respond to Him?
