#### 1:4 The Son has become much superior to the angels

#### Because He has inherited a more excellent name

God the Son became the person of Jesus. Therefore, Jesus got all that God the Son had.

#### 1:5 Jesus is the special Son of God-the-Father

#### 1:6 Jesus is to be worshipped by the angels of God

Firstborn - special relationship with his father, and had supremacy in all the father's business

#### 1:7-8a Angels are controlled by God, whereas the Son is God

#### 1:8b-9 The Son is God, the eternal King

One with the God the Hebrews knew

#### 1:10-12 The Son is the Lord of all creation

The Son is the creator of the heavens and the earth.

Eternal, all-powerful, unchanging

These things are only true of God.

#### 1:13-14 The Son is the King, whereas the angels are servants

Although the Son is superior to the angels, they aren't worthless. They have important ministry to Jesus' people.
