5:11 **Don't get complacent, lazy of hearing**

Keep learning to grow more mature.

5:12 **Don't stay at the beginning with the basics**

Grow to be a teacher, to make disciples.

Live out what you learn from the word of God.

5:13 **Don't stay drinking milk with the other babies**

We have to live what we learn from the word of God, to be able to handle the deeper teachings.

Every time you learn something from God's word, make it a habit to do something with it.

Spend time with people who are more spiritually mature.
