### **Be Diligent to Be Supremely Full of It**

Hebrews 6:11-20

#### **6:11 Demonstrate diligence toward full assurance of hope.**

Hope is about looking forward to something.

Christian hope is not a wish, but a confident expectation about things to come, which God has promised us.

Jesus is going to come back again.

He will resurrect those who trust Him.

He will save us from punishment for our sins.

And we will have eternal life with God.

Hope has emotion built in, joyfulness.

We can be supremely full, brimming, with this hope.

6:12a **Diligent, instead of lazy**

6:12b **Waiting with faith and patience for the promises to be fulfilled**

6:13-18 **Abraham, and our shared hope in the Christ**

(ref.: Genesis 22:16-18)(also see Galatians 3:16)

We who have already trusted in Christ for salvation, may still need to grasp onto the hope that we can have in Christ.

6:19-20 **Christ and our future in Him is an anchor in storms.**

The future that is promised to us, Christ has already entered ahead of us.
