## Requirements to be Forgiven by God

Hebrews 9:15-22

**Text sermon questions, during the sermon, to (602) 824-8030**

**9:15 Christ's death makes it possible for all to receive the eternal inheritance of heaven**

Christ's death paid the price for all transgressions - all the breaking of God's commandments.

To get our sins forgiven, we must respond to God's call/invitation to trust Jesus Christ.

**9:16-17 Illustration: For a will to be in effect the one who arranged it must die.**

Christ's death was necessary for anyone to receive the eternal inheritance of heaven.

**9:18-22 God's covenants require the blood of the appropriate sacrifice to be applied to the people for them to be forgiven.**

Old covenant, Moses sprinkled with blood to cleanse.

Things had to be ritually cleansed to be acceptable for worshipping God.

New covenant, we are not able to worship God, in a way God accepts, if we are not cleansed by the blood of Christ.

Not only cleansing, but forgiveness is brought about for us by the blood of Christ, so we can be in right relationship with God.

Each person who wants to be forgiven must be figuratively sprinkled with the blood of Christ.

We get that by faith/trust, in Jesus Christ and His sacrificial death for us.
