2:42 Four things they were regularly devoted to:

Listening to the apostles teaching

Fellowship - sharing, possessions and life - relationship like family

2:44-45 They were regularly together and shared all things in common.

They met one another's material needs. (ref.: 1 Cor. 8:1-4)

Four principles for this:

- 1) We should consider believers like family.
- 2) What we might be willing to do for members of our family of origin, we should consider doing for other Christians.
- 3) Our signal to consider giving is that they have real needs.
- 4) It's up to you, as God leads you, to decide what to do.

2:43 Everyone kept feeling a sense of awe.

2:46 Day by day devoted in the temple and house to house.
